## How the Sandra Shreve-Pickens Fund Came Into Existence



Back in the early 1980s, a fund was established at the Hamot Credit Union for the School's use. Alums would regularly donate money to this fund and eventually there was a substantial amount in the fund.

Since Sandra's name was on the account, as an authorized user, but she didn't want to be audited for not claiming any earned interest on the account, the school decided to turn it into a

trust fund. The School wanted to name it after an alumnus and Sandra was not only very involved in the school but had been an active CRNA at Hamot the longest, so the fund was named after her.

Shortly after that, in 1983, a donor by the name of Doug Fuller donated to the fund but was very upset that no one had informed him of her passing. Since she had not passed away, it became quite the joke for Sandra!

Sandra Shreve-Pickens did pass away on Oct. 8, 2021, at the age of 78. She had retired from Hamot Medical Center in 2000 as the chief nurse anesthetist and retired fully in 2007.

Her legacy continues in the fund named after her which continues to award scholarships which enable student nurse anesthetists to attend regional and national conferences as well as helping to buy needed equipment for the School's Simulation Lab.
